We are now well into the 2nd year of the Orphans Foundation Fund / CORDAID street children project. Careful surveying, screening, selection and recruitment of street children for the 2nd year was carried out and 50 were selected for undergoing rehabilitation. Each young person has enrolled for vocational training course of their own choice . Thirty-one joined the cooking and hotel services course, 16 are studying automotive mechanics, 2 had a spark for welding,

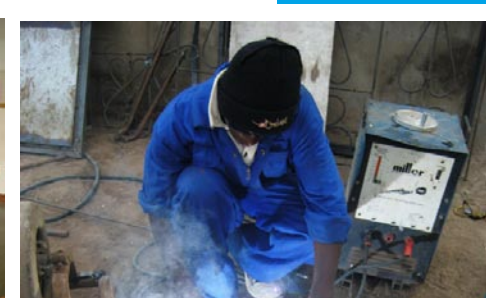

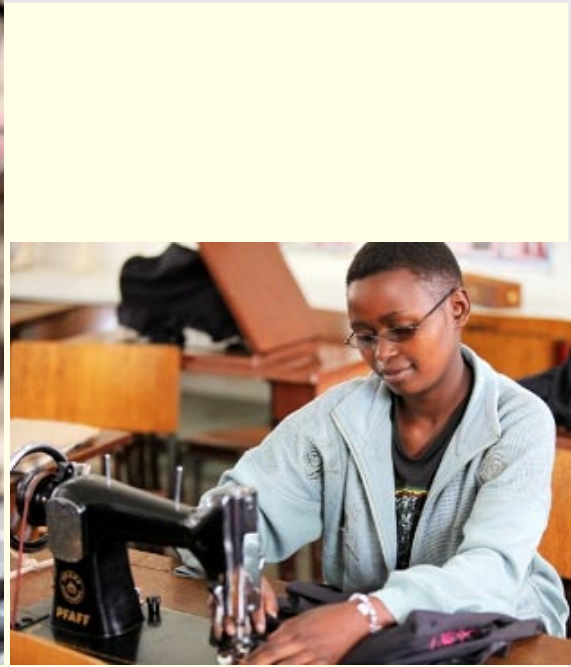
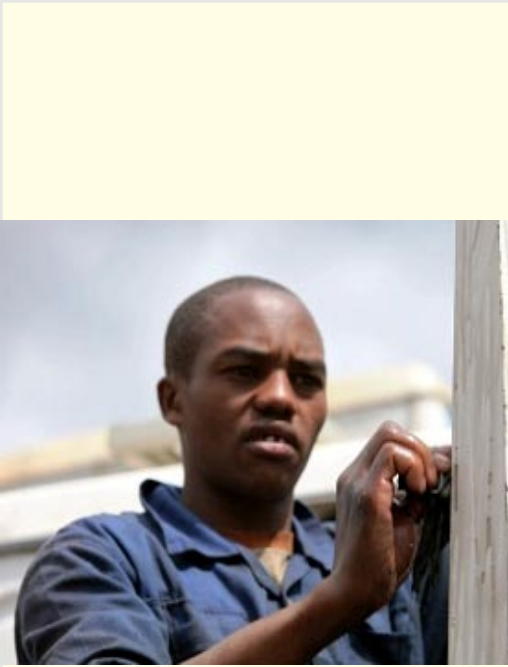
